HOUSE AMENDMENT "C" to HOUSE DOCUMENT 475,

Entitled AN ACT for the Care and Preservation of Shade
and Ornamental Trees.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section four is hereby amended by striking out all of said
2 section and substituting in place thereof the following:

Public shade trees may be thinned, cut down, or removed
2 by the owner of the soil only with the consent of a tree
3 warden or park commissioner, but such trees shall not be
4 trimmed, cut down, or removed in any case by a tree war-
5 den or park commissioner except with the consent of such
6 owner. Nothing in this section, however, shall be con-
7 strued to prevent the trimming, cutting or removal of trees
8 where such trimming, cutting or removal is ordered by

9 proper authority to lay out, alter or widen the location of
10 highways, to lessen the danger of travel on highways or
11 to suppress tree pests or insects.
