STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

AN ACT Amending the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Fifteen, Chapter Three Hundred Fifty, Entitled "An Act Relative to the Hours of Employment of Women and Children."

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section one of chapter three hundred fifty of the public laws of nineteen hundred fifteen is hereby amended by striking out the word "fifty-four" in the seventh line of said section and inserting in place thereof the word 'forty-eight,' so that said section shall read as follows:

'Section 1. Restrictions on hours of labor for women and
2 minors. No male minor under sixteen years of age, and
3 no female shall be employed in any workshop, factory,
4 manufacturing or mechanical establishment or laundry more
5 than eight hours in any one day, except when a different
6 apportionment of the hours of labor is made for the sole
7 purpose of making a shorter day's work for one day of
8 the week, and in no case shall the hours of labor exceed
9 nine hours in one day or forty-eight hours in a week.'
