### STATE OF MAINE

#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

AN ACT to establish a Normal School to be located at Dexter in the County of Penobscot.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. A Normal School, to be known as the Central 2 Maine State Normal School, is hereby created and estab-3 lished, upon such plan as the board of trustees of Normal 4 Schools may direct.

Sect. 2. Said Normal School shall be located at Dexter, in 2 the county of Penobscot, provided the inhabitants of said 3 town of Dexter shall within six months after the approval 4 of this act donate and cause to be conveyed to the State a

5 suitable lot of land for the use and purposes of said school,0 which shall be approved by the board of trustees of Normal7 Schools.

Sect. 3. Said trustees, upon conveyance to the State of 2 such lot of land, are authorized, instructed, and directed to 3 procure the erection of such building or buildings thereon, 4 for the use and purposes of said school, as they may ap-5 prove and determine.

Sect. 4. The sum of twenty-five thousand dollars is here-2 by appropriated for the year nineteen hundred and fifteen; 3 the same, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to be 4 used by said trustees of Normal Schools in the erection of 5 the needful building or buildings on said lot, for the use and 6 purposes of such school.

Sect. 5. Upon the completion of said building or build-2 ings, said trustees are authorized, instructed, and directed 3 to procure teachers and put in operation a school in which, 4 besides the courses of study pursued in the other Normal 5 Schools of the State, shall be established a course of study 6 in Agriculture; the cost of operating such school to be paid 7 out of the Public School funds of the State.
