IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Town of Union for the Payment
of Additional State School Funds for the Year Nineteen
Hundred Eighteen.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated out
2 of state school funds for the year nineteen hundred nineteen
3 in favor of the town of Union the sum of two hundred
4 ninety-five dollars and eighty-four cents, such amount be-
5 ing due said town out of state school funds for the year
6 nineteen hundred eighteen and not received because of an
7 error in the census returns of said town for that year.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The school census return for the year nineteen hundred eighteen for the town of Union including the names of all persons between the ages of five and twenty-one years showed two hundred twenty such persons according to the certificate filed by the superintendent of schools. It is found, however, that the list of names accompanying said certificate shows the names and ages of two hundred ninety persons between the ages of five and twenty-one years resident of the town of Union on April first, nineteen hundred eighteen. The superintendent of schools of the town of Union certifies that the list of names is correct and that through some clerical error his certificate showing only two hundred twenty names was filed in place of a certificate showing the full number of two hundred ninety.

The amount of state school funds apportioned to the town of Union on the basis of the certificate filed by the superintendent of schools for the year nineteen hundred eighteen was: School and mill fund, \$679.53; common school fund, \$875.39; total, \$1554.92. The amount which would have been apportioned had the number of names on the census list been two hundred ninety is: School and mill fund, \$895.74; common school fund, \$955.02; total, \$1850.76. The attached resolve is for the difference in these two amounts properly due the town of Union.
