STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

RESOLVE, appropriating Money to Aid in Screening Lakes
and Ponds.

Resolved: That the sum of three thousand four hundred
2 dollars be, and is hereby, appropriated, to be paid out of
3 license fees collected of non-resident fishermen and to be
4 expended by the commissioner of inland fisheries and game,
5 to aid in screening the following named lakes and ponds:
6 provided, however, that no appropriation hereafter specified
7 for the erection of a screen at the outlet of a lake or pond
8 shall be available until the town in which the outlet of the lake
9 or pond to be screened is situated, or some other town in the
10 county in which said waters are situated, shall have, in legal

11 town meeting, and having an article in said town meeting
12 for that purpose, by vote of record, voted to assume all
13 liability for the keeping of said screen at all times free from
14 sticks, leaves and all debris, so that the same will not become
15 clogged and prevent the free running of the water through the
16 same, and provided, further, that said appropriation shall not
17 be available until citizens of the county in which said lake or
18 pond to be screened is situated shall have paid into the state
19 treasury the balance necessary, as found by the commissioner
20 of inland fisheries and game, to erect said screen.

Any appropriation herein named, or part thereof, not
2 expended during the year nineteen nineteen, shall be avail-
3 able during the year nineteen twenty.
