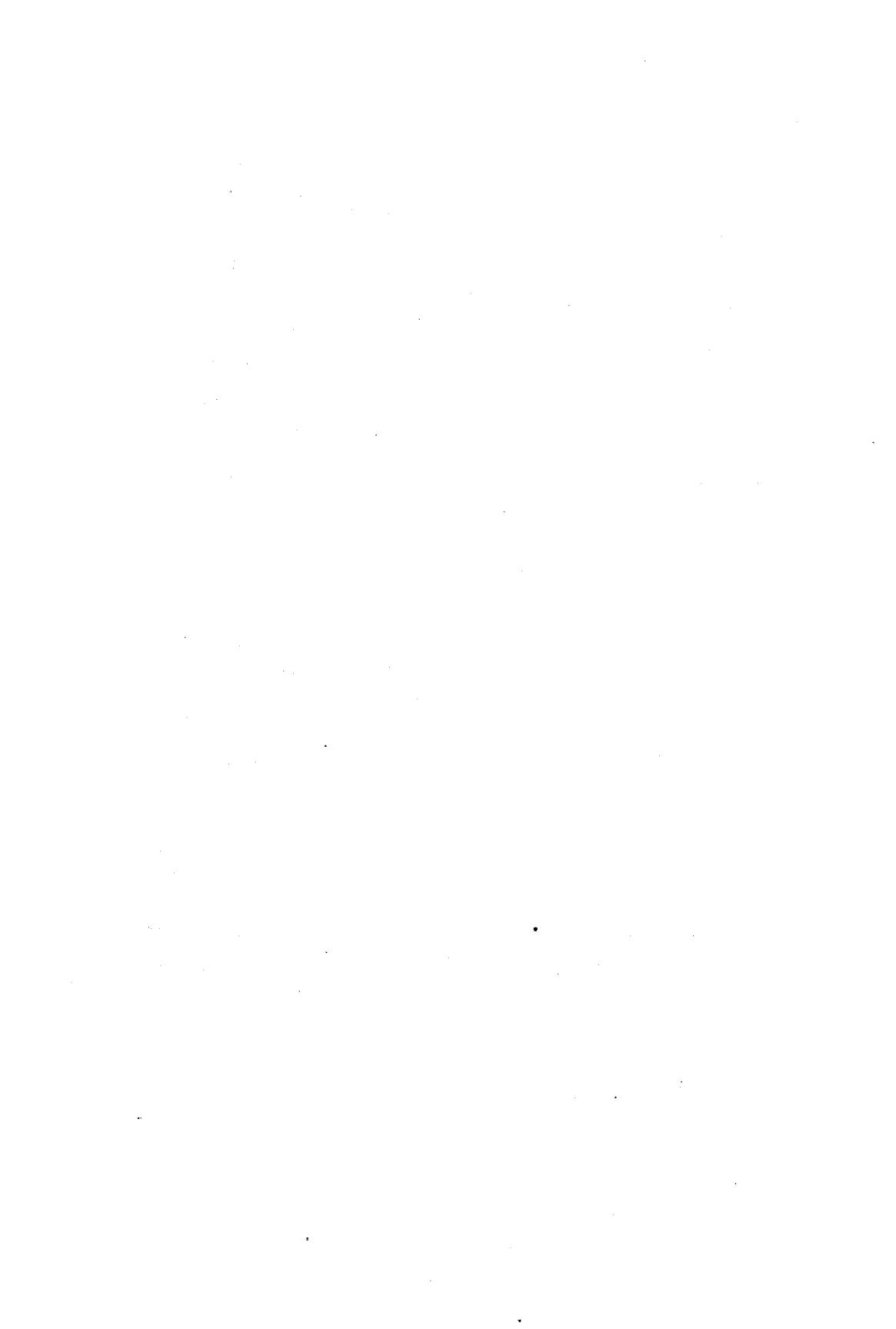

RESOLVE, in Favor of Horace Purinton Company for Material Furnished by Them in the Construction of the Women's Reformatory at Skowhegan.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated in
2 favor of Horace Purinton Company, the sum of two hun-
3 dred and forty-one dollars and forty-six cents, in payment
4 of their bill for that amount for materials furnished by
5 them in the construction of the Women's Reformatory at
6 Skowhegan.



STATEMENT OF FACTS

Horace Purinton Company, a corporation having an office and place of business at Waterville, were requested to furnish brick for the Women's Reformatory by George H. Wilbur Son, the contractor. Hon. Clyde H. Smith, a resident of Skowhegan, and who was chairman of the building committee of the Women's Reformatory building, agreed to protect us in the payment of the brick so far as he was able to do so by retaining money enough from what would be due Wilbur & Son to pay the amount due us on brick, which he had a right to do as expressly provided in contract with the said Wilbur & Son. We received an order on the State Treasurer for two thousand dollars as shown in statement of account and received the money as per above agreement and we respectfully request that the balance be paid to us as agreed.

George H. Wilbur & Son went into bankruptcy.
