STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

RESOLVE, providing a state pension for George A. Penney.

Resolved: That the sum of twelve dollars per month
2 be paid to George A. Penney of Montville, son of the late
3 Augustus Penney, a soldier of the Civil war, payable quar-
4 terly from the fund appropriated for military pensions, be-
5 ginnig January first, nineteen hundred and nineteen, and
6 continuing during the pleasure of the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The above mentioned Geo. A. Penney is a son of the late Augustus Penney of Montville. He is a very worthy citizen and has been in poor health all his life and is in very needy circumstances. He is a cripple having to walk with a crutch and cane. He has always worked all he was able to but now he has got where he cannot work and has to have some aid.
