AN ACT for the Better Protection of Alewives in the Waters  
of This State.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. No person shall at any time take any alewives  
2 in any river, brook or stream which is one hundred feet  
3 or less in width. No person shall at any time take any  
4 alewives with a dipnet in any waters of this state, except  
5 that dipnets may be used for taking alewives out of weirs  
6 in tidal waters.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall  
2 be punished by a fine of not less than one hundred nor  
3 more than two hundred dollars for each offense.

Sect. 3. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with this  
2 act are hereby repealed.
