STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

AN ACT to Amend Section Twenty of Chapter One Hundred Seventeen of the Revised Statutes as Amended by Chapter One Hundred Seventy-nine of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Seventeen Relating to the Employing of Clerks and Agent by the State Superintendent of Public Schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section twenty of chapter one hundred seventeen of the
2 revised statutes as amended by chapter one hundred sev-
3 enty-nine of the public laws of nineteen hundred seven-
4 teen is hereby further amended by striking out all of said
5 section after the word "paid" in the fourth line thereof
6 and substituting therefor the following words: 'out of such

7 funds as may be provided for that purpose. He shall ap-
8 point a deputy, and shall employ such agents as may be
9 authorized by law and such clerical assistance as he may
10 deem necessary and as may be approved by the governor
11 and council for carrying on the work of his office. The
12 deputy state superintendent of public schools and the agents
13 employed by the state superintendent in accordance with
14 the provisions of this section shall receive such salaries as
15 the governor and council may approve within the appro-
16 priation made by the legislature and shall also receive their
17 necessary traveling expenses incurred in the performance
18 of their official duties,' so that said section when amended
19 shall read as follows :

'Sect. 20. The state superintendent of public schools
2 shall receive an annual salary of four thousand dollars. He
3 shall also receive his actual cash expenses incurred in the
4 performance of his official duties which shall be paid out
5 of such funds as may be provided for that purpose. He
6 shall appoint a deputy, and shall employ such agents as
7 may be authorized by law and such clerical assistance as
8 he may deem necessary and as may be approved by the
9 governor and council for carrying on the work of his of-
10 fice. The deputy state superintendent of public schools
11 and the agents employed by the state superintendent in
12 accordance with the provisions of this section shall receive
13 such salaries as the governor and council may approve

14 within the appropriation made by the legislature and shall
15 also receive their necessary traveling expenses incurred in
16 the performance of their official duties.'
