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STATE OF MAINE

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND  
NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

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AN ACT to Amend Section Twenty-one of Chapter One Hun-  
dred Twenty-seven of the Revised Statutes Relating to Sale  
of Intoxicating Liquors Prohibited.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section twenty-one of chapter one hundred twenty-seven  
2 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding after  
3 the word "liquors" in the third line thereof the words 'all  
4 beverages containing more than one-half of one per cent of  
5 alcohol,' so that said section as amended shall read as fol-  
6 lows:

'Sect. 21. Sale of intoxicating liquors prohibited; defini-  
2 tion. No person shall at any time, by himself, his clerk,

3 servant or agent, directly or indirectly, sell any intoxicat-  
4 ing liquors of whatever origin; wine, ale, porter, strong  
5 beer, lager beer, and all other malt liquors, all beverages  
6 containing more than one-half of one per cent of alcohol,  
7 and cider when kept or deposited with intent to sell the  
8 same for tipping purposes, or as a beverage, as well as all  
9 distilled spirits, are declared intoxicating within the mean-  
10 ing of this chapter; but this enumeration shall not prevent  
11 any other pure or mixed liquors from being considered in-  
12 toxicating.
