STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

AN ACT to Amend Section One Hundred Four of Chapter Sixteen of the Revised Statutes Relating to the Reports of Academies and Private Schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:Section one hundred four of chapter sixteen of the revised2 statutes is hereby amended by striking out all of said section

3 and substituting therefor the following, so that said section 4 when amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 104. Every educational institution receiving state 2 aid, and the officers and teachers of every academy receiving 3 money from the state, and of every academy or private

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4 school approved for attendance or tuition purposes, shall 5 annually, on or before the first day of August report to the 6 state superintendent of public schools the total and average 7 attendance, an account of the moneys received and expended 8 during the preceding year, the number of instructors, and 9 such schools as are approved for state aid or tuition pur-10 poses shall report such other items as he may require. Such 11 reports shall be published in the annual report of the state 12 superintendent of public schools. Every such educational 13 institution failing to comply with the above requirements 14 shall forfeit whatever aid or assistance it would otherwise 15 receive from the state. Wherever in sections ninety-eight 16 to one hundred and four inclusive, the word "academy" 17 occurs, it shall be construed to include "seminary or 18 institute."

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
