AN ACT to Increase the Salary of the Recorder of the Bath  
Municipal Court.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Chapter 516, section 1 of the private and special laws of  
2 1897, amended by chapter 330 of the private and special  
3 laws of 1903 is hereby amended by striking out between  
4 the word "of" and the word "dollars" in the twelfth line  
5 of said section the words "seventy-five" and inserting in  
6 place thereof the words 'two hundred,' so that said section  
7 as amended shall read as follows:

'Section 1. There shall be appointed by the governor, for  
2 said court, a recorder, who shall keep the records of said  
3 court when requested so to do by the judge; and in case

4 of the absence of the judge from the court room, or when  
5 the office of judge shall be vacant, the recorder shall have  
6 and exercise all the powers of the judge and perform all  
7 the duties required of said judge, and shall be empowered  
8 to sign and issue all processes and papers, and to do all  
9 acts as fully and with the same effect as the judge could  
10 do were he acting in the premises, and the signature of  
11 the recorder as such, shall be sufficient evidence of his  
12 right to act instead of the judge. The said recorder shall  
13 receive a salary of two hundred dollars per annum, which  
14 shall be in full for all services performed by him, and  
15 which shall be paid him in the same manner as the salary  
16 of the judge of said court is now provided to be paid. Said  
17 recorder shall reside in Bath, and shall hold his office until  
18 another is appointed in his stead.'
