STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

AN ACT to Incorporate the Western Maine Branch of the
Woman's Board of Missions.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Agnes H. Carter, Isabelle C. Harmon, Amy P.
2 Nickerson, Mary P. Clay, Annie F. Bailey, Mary L. Thomp-
3 son and Patty Steadman, their associates and successors,
4 are hereby created and constituted a body corporate under
5 the name of Western Maine Branch of the Woman's Board
6 of Missions, with all the powers and privileges and sub-
7 ject to all the duties, liabilities and restrictions incident to
8 similar corporations created under the laws of this state.

Sect. 2. The said corporation may take and hold by purchase, gift, devise or bequest, personal or real estate in all not exceeding in value one hundred thousand dollars owned at any one time, and may use and dispose thereof only for the purposes for which the corporation is organized.

Sect. 3. The objects and purposes of this corporation shall be to collect, receive and hold money or other property given by voluntary contributions, donations, devises, bequests or otherwise, to be expended for the support of such missionaries, teachers, Bible readers, schools and other missionary work in foreign lands, as may be selected by the board of officers, with the approbation, and through the agency of the Woman's Board of Missions, located in the city of Boston, in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

Sect. 4. The said corporation may have and use a common seal, and the same may alter and change at pleasure; it may appoint such officers as may be deemed expedient, and may make, ordain, and put into execution such by-laws and regulations as shall be deemed necessary and convenient for the well ordering and government of the same, not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, the laws of this state, or the laws of the United States.
