STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

AN ACT to Amend Section Eleven of Chapter One Hundred Seventeen of the Revised Statutes Relating to the Salaries of Stenographers of Cumberland and Kennebec Superior Courts, as Amended by Chapter Two Hundred Forty-nine of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Seventeen.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section eleven of chapter one hundred seventeen of the
2 revised statutes as amended by chapter two hundred forty-
3 nine of the public laws of nineteen hundred seventeen, is
4 hereby amended by striking out in the third and fourth
5 lines the words "Cumberland, eighteen hundred dollars a
6 year," and inserting in place thereof the words 'Cumber-

7 land, twenty-one hundred dollars a year,' so that said sec-
8 tion as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 11. The salaries of the stenographers of the su-
2 perior courts, to be paid quarterly from the treasuries of
3 their counties, in full for all services formerly chargeable
4 to the counties, are as follows: Cumberland, twenty-one
5 hundred dollars a year; Kennebec, eighteen hundred dol-
6 lars a year. They shall also receive from the county in
7 which the court is held, their expenses when in attendance
8 upon court away from their places of residence, but not
9 otherwise; a detailed statement of such expense actually
10 and reasonably incurred shall be approved by the presiding
11 justice.'
