STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY

AN ACT to provide for the Registration of Women prior to the State and National Elections of the Year 1920.

Whereas, by the adoption of the Nineteenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States, proclaimed by the State Department of the United States on August 26th, 1920, every female citizen of this state has the right to vote at any National, State, City or Town election, if qualified except as to sex as required by the constitution and laws of this State, and under existing registration laws, many women of this State otherwise qualified, cannot be registered prior to the State and National elections to be held in the year one thousand nine hundred and twenty, and will be prevented from exercising

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their constitutional right to vote, whereby an emergency exists, and the enactment of additional registration laws providing for the registration of female voters prior to the next State and National elections is an emergency measure, immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, now therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. In addition to the session of the municipal 2 officers now authorized by Section 41, Chapter 5 of the Re-3 vised Statutes, the municipal officers of every town con-4 taining less than five hundred voters shall be in session on 5 the four secular days next preceding the second Monday of 6 September, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, and 7 also the four secular days preceding the Tuesday next after 8 the first Monday in November, one thousand nine hundred 9 and twenty for the purpose of receiving applications of male 10 and female persons claiming a right to vote. In all towns 11 having five hundred or more registered voters and in all 12 cities having less than three thousand inhabitants the mu-13 nicipal officers shall receive applications of male and fe-14 male persons claiming a right to vote on the six secular 15 days next preceding the second Monday of September, one 16 thousand nine hundred and twenty, and also on the six sec-17 ular days preceding the Tuesday next after the first Mon-18 day in November, one thousand nine hundred and twenty. 19 In cities of three thousand and less than nineteen thousand 20 inhabitants and in cities of not less than thirty-five thou-

21 sand inhabitants, the Boards of Registration shall be in 22 session from nine o'clock in the forenoon to one o'clock in 23 the afternoon and from three o'clock to five o'clock in the 24 afternoon and from seven o'clock to nine o'clock in the af-25 ternoon on each of the ten secular days next preceding the 26 second Monday of September, one thousand nine hundred 27 and twenty, on the first eight to receive evidence touching 28 the qualifications of male and female voters therein, to reg-29 ister those entitled thereto, and to revise and correct the 30 voting list, and on the latter two of said secular days to 31 verify the correctness of said lists and to complete and 32 close the records of said session. The Boards of Registra-33 tion in cities of three thousand and less than nineteen thou-34 sand inhabitants shall also be in session for the purpose of 35 registration of male and female voters on the ten secular 36 days next prior to the national election of one thousand 37 nine hundred and twenty, during the hours fixed by this 38 section for registration in such cities for the State election. 39 In cities of not less than nineteen thousand and less than 40 thirty-five thousand inhabitants, the Boards of Registra-41 tion shall be in session from nine o'clock in the forenoon to 42 one o'clock in the afternoon and from three o'clock to five 43 o'clock in the afternoon and from seven o'clock to nine 44 o'clock in the afternoon on each of the twenty-five secular 45 days next prior to the presidential election in one thousand 46 nine hundred and twenty, on the first eighteen of said sec-

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47 ular days to receive evidence touching the qualification of 48 voters therein, to register those entitled thereto and to re-49 vise and correct the voting list and on the latter seven of 50 said secular days to verify the correctness of said lists and 51 to complete and close the records of said session. In all 52 cities of three thousand or more and less than thirty-five 53 thousand inhabitants on the last of said secular days herein 54 provided, at eleven o'clock in the afternoon certified copies 55 of said voting lists shall be delivered to the clerks of said 56 cities and receipts taken therefor, except that on the last 57 of said days devoted to registration, the session of the 58 Board shall close at nine o'clock in the afternoon and no 50 name shall be added to or stricken from said lists there-60 after. In cities of not less than thirty-five thousand in-61 habitants the Board of Registration shall close its session 62 on the last of the secular days devoted to registration prior 63 to the National election of one thousand nine hundred and 64 twenty at five o'clock in the afternoon, and shall forthwith 65 verify the correctness of the lists and complete and close 66 the records of said session relating to said National elec-67 tion, and on or before eleven o'clock in the afternoon of 68 the secular day preceding said National election deliver 69 certified copies of said voting lists to the clerks of said 70 cities and take receipts therefor. In cities of not less than 71 nineteen thousand and less than thirty-five thousand inhab-72 itants, the Boards of Registration shall be in session from 73 nine o'clock in the forenoon to one o'clock in the afternoon

74 and from three o'clock to five o'clock in the afternoon and 75 from seven o'clock to nine o'clock in the afternoon on each 76 of the twelve secular days next prior to the next State 77 election, on the first ten of said secular days to receive evi-78 dence touching the qualification of voters therein, to regis-79 ter those entitled thereto and to revise and correct the vot-80 ing lists and on the latter two of said secular days to verify 81 the correctness of said lists and to complete and close the 82 records of said session. Boards of Registration are author-83 ized to remain in session for registration of voters on any E4 day except the last day of each session prior to the next 85 State and National election for more hours than otherwise 86 prescribed if in their judgment it may be necessary. With-87 out limitation upon the right of female citizens to register 88 for any future National, State, City or Town election it is Sc, hereby further provided that Boards of Registration in cit-90 ies of not less than nineteen thousand and less than thirtyo1 five thousand inhabitants shall register female voters at any oz session held prior to the State election of one thousand nine 93 hundred and twenty.

Sect. 2. Municipal officers of towns and of cities having 2 less than three thousand inhabitants and the chairman of 3 the several Boards of Registration in all other cities may at 4 the special registration sessions hereby authorized and at 5 the regular sessions held for the registration of voters for 6 the next State and National elections employ such clerks and 7 assistants as may be necessary and may further in each

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8 town and city appoint such number of deputies as said mu-9 nicipal officers and said chairman shall deem necessary, an 10 equal number of deputies to be appointed from each of the II dominant political parties, who shall have the same powers 12 and duties as the municipal officers or members of the 13 Board of Registration, subject, however, to the supervision 14 and control of the municipal officers and Board of Regis-15 tration in the respective town or city. All municipal officers, 16 boards of registration, deputies, assistants and clerks shall 17 at the special registration session held under this act be 18 governed in the performance of their duties by the pro-19 visions of Chapter five of the Revised Statutes and Acts 20 additional thereto and amendatory thereof, except in so far 21 as the same are modified, amended or superseded by this The compensation of such deputies, assistants and 22 Act. 23 clerks employed as herein provided shall be fixed by the 24 respective municipal officers or Boards or Registration, 25 shall not exceed the compensation received by such muni-26 cipal officers or members of Boards of Registration and 27 shall be paid by the respective towns and cities.

Sect. 3. This act shall apply only to registration of voters 2 preceding the State and National elections to be held re-3 spectively in September and November, one thousand nine 4 hundred and twenty.

Sect. 4. In view of the emergency expressed in the pre-2 amble hereof this Act shall take effect when approved.
