### STATE OF MAINE

#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT to Regulate the Use of Motor Vehicles with Solid Tires.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section 1. It shall be unlawful to operate any motor
2 vehicle which is equipped with solid tires, on any public
3 road or highway in the state at a speed greater than fifteen
4 miles per hour, and all such vehicles shall be equipped with
5 a governor which shall limit the speed of said vehicle to
6 fifteen miles per hour.

Sect. 2. It shall be unlawful to operate any motor vehicle, 2 which is equipped with solid tires, on any public road or 3 highway in the state with a load weighing more than five 4 tons.

Sect. 3. Any person violating any provision of this act 2 shall be punished by a fine of twenty-five dollars for the 3 first offense; on the second offense he shall be punished by 4 a fine of fifty dollars and his license to operate a motor ve-5 hicle in this state shall be suspended for one year.

Sect. 4. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent herewith are 2 hereby repealed.
