STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT Requiring Political Advertisements to Be Signed.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Whoever writes, prints, posts or distributes, or causes to 2 be written, printed, posted or distributed, a circular, poster 3 or advertisement which is designated to promote the nom-4 ination or election of a candidate for public office or to 5 injure and defeat the nomination or election of any candi-6 date for public office, or to influence the voters on any con-7 stitutional amendment, or to influence the vote of any mem-8 ber of the legislature, unless there appears upon such circu-9 lar or poster or advertisement, in a conspicuous place, either 10 the name of the chairman or secretary or of two officers

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11 of the organization issuing the same, or of the person who 12 is responsible therefor, with his name and address, shall 13 be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof 14 shall be fined not exceeding one hundred dollars, or im-15 prisoned in the county jail not to exceed thirty days, or by 16 both such fine and imprisonment.

Provided, that nothing in this act shall apply to the edi-2 torial or news articles of any magazine or newspaper where 3 the same is not a political advertisement, nor to cards, post-4 ers, lithographs, or circulars, issued by a candidate adver-5 tising his own candidacy.
