RESOLVE, in Favor of Building a Road in the Town of  
Eagle Lake to Open Farm Lands for Settlement.

---

Resolved: That there be and hereby is appropriated for  
2 the fiscal year ending June thirty, nineteen hundred and  
3 twenty-two, the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1000) to  
4 aid in building a road in the town of Eagle Lake for the  
5 purpose of opening farm lands for settlement.

Providing that there be appropriated by the town of Eagle  
2 Lake the sum of one thousand dollars for the same purpose.  
3 Providing also that the county of Aroostook shall furnish  
4 an equal sum of one thousand dollars for the same purpose.

5 All money to be expended under the supervision of the state  
6 highway department and the county commissioners.

### STATEMENT OF FACTS

The legislature of 1919 appropriated \$250 for this road. The town of Eagle Lake voted and expended \$250, and the county of Aroostook and Edwin C. Burleigh Estate contributed \$250 each.

We cut the right of way, stumped and turnpiked  $1\frac{1}{4}$  miles, but did not have enough money to build the small bridges, and hauled the necessary stones needed in certain parts of it. The amount asked in this resolve will allow us to reach the second row of lots and finish the work commenced last year.
