#### STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT to Amend Section One Hundred and Sixteen of Chapter Four of the Revised Statutes Relating to Dogs Found Hunting or Chasing Moose, Caribou or Deer, or Found Running at Large in the Woods During Close Season on Deer.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section one hundred and sixteen of chapter four of the
revised statutes is hereby amended by inserting after the
word "purpose" in the third line thereof, the following
words: 'or any dog found running at large in the woods,
during close season on deer, outside the immediate care of
its owner or keeper,' so that said section, as amended, shall
read as follows:

'Sect. 116. Any person may at any time lawfully kill any 2 dog found hunting or chasing moose, caribou, or deer, or 3 any dog kept and used for that purpose, or any dog found 4 running at large in the woods, during close season on deer, 5 outside the immediate care of its owner or keeper. Any 6 person may lawfully kill a dog which suddenly assaults 7 him or another person when peaceably walking or riding, 8 or is found worrying, wounding, or killing any domestic 9 animal when said dog is outside of the enclosure or imme-10 diate care of his owner or keeper.'
