**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND  
NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE**

AN ACT to Amend Section Thirty-seven of Chapter Thirty-three of the Revised Statutes, as Amended by Chapter Two Hundred and Nineteen of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Seventeen, and by Chapter One Hundred and Thirty-one of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Nineteen, Relating to the Protection of Moose.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section thirty-seven of chapter thirty-three of  
2 the revised statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred  
3 and nineteen of the public laws of nineteen hundred and  
4 seventeen and by chapter one hundred and thirty-one of the  
5 public laws of nineteen hundred and nineteen, is hereby

6 amended by striking out all of said section and substituting  
7 therefor the following section:

‘Sect. 37. Whoever, at any time, for a period of four  
2 years from November nineteenth, nineteen hundred and  
3 twenty-one, hunts, pursues or kills any moose, or has in  
4 possession any part or parts thereof, whenever or wherever  
5 taken, caught or killed, shall pay a fine of not less than two  
6 hundred nor more than three hundred dollars and costs  
7 for each offense, or be imprisoned not exceeding four  
8 months, or shall be subject to both said fine and imprison-  
9 ment.

Provided, however, that the commissioner of inland fish-  
2 eries and game may, upon payment of a fee of five dollars  
3 by any person who has legally killed a moose beyond the  
4 limits of this state, issue a special transportation tag per-  
5 mitting the importation of such moose into this state, for  
6 consumption herein, under such rules and regulations as  
7 said commissioner may establish.’

Sect. 2. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with this  
2 act are hereby repealed.
