House Amendment "A" to Joint Order Relating to Appointment of a Committee for Investigation of Legislative Enactments Relating to Expenditures of Money by Department of State.

Amend said order by striking out the word "three" where 2 it appears and inserting the word 'seven' in its place.

Whereas, the expenditures of the state have increased sev-

- 2 eral fold during the last twenty years and,
 - Whereas, the state is now assuming many of the burdens
- 2 formerly borne by municipalities and individuals, and

Whereas, the policy of the state to extend its benevolences

2 has been long established, and

Whereas, the present tax levies of state, county and mu-2 nicipality combined are becoming grievous and burdensome 3 to our citizens, and

Whereas, it may be possible to obtain some relief upon 2 proper investigation,

Now therefore, be it ordered, the Senate concurring, that 2 a special committee of three on the part of the House, with 3 as many as the Senate may join, be appointed to investi-4 gate all existing legislative enactments relating to the expenditure of money by the various departments of the state, 6 and collate such expenditures over a period of years, and 7 report, to the governor and council not later than April 8 first, nineteen hundred and twenty-two, with such recomponendations as may seem proper, and that the governor be 10 requested to communicate to the eighty-first legislature, 11 as soon as convenient after the assembling of said Eighty-12 first legislature, such recommendations as he may deem 13 proper regarding the financial affairs of the state.

Said committee shall have authority to employ all neces-2 sary clerical assistance and shall publish their report and 3 recommendations. All expenses pertaining to said investi-4 gation shall be paid by the governor and council out of 5 the contingent fund of the state.
