STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Inflict Capital Punishment for Murder.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Chapter one hundred twenty of the revised
2 statutes is hereby amended by striking out the whole of
3 section one thereof, and inserting in place thereof the fol-
4 lowing, so that said section as amended, shall read as follows:

‘Section 1. I. Murder is the unlawful killing of a human
2 being with malice aforethought, either express or implied.

‘II. When murder is committed with express malice afore-
2 thought, or in perpetrating or attempting to perpetrate a
3 crime punishable by death, or imprisonment for life, or for
4 an unlimited term of years, it shall be deemed murder of
5 the first degree and punished with death.

'III. When murder is committed otherwise than is set
2 forth in the preceding section, it shall be deemed murder of
3 the second degree, and punished by imprisonment for life.

'IV. The jury, finding a person guilty of murder, shall
2 find whether he is guilty of murder in the first or second
3 degree. When a person is found guilty of murder by con-
4 fession in open court, the court, from testimony, shall de-
5 termine the degree of murder, and sentence accordingly.'

Sect. 2. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent herewith,
2 are hereby repealed.
