STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Giving a Right to Bring an Action on the Case for Damages Caused by Interference with Log Driving by Storage Dams.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Any unusual expense incurred solely by reason of interference with log driving on a floatable stream by a storage dam shall be recoverable against the owner of said dam in an action on the case.

Sect. 2. Whenever the cost of driving logs, wood or lumber on any floatable stream is increased by a storage or reservoir dam, an action to recover such additional cost may be maintained by the owner of such logs, wood or lumber.
