STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, in Favor of Adelaide France of Sedgwick for State Pension.

Resolved: That the sum of twelve dollars per month be 2 paid to Adelaide France of Sedgwick in the county of Han-3 cock, widow of a Civil war pensioner, in quarterly install-4 ments from the fund appropriated for soldiers' pensions, 5 from January first, nineteen hundred and twenty-five, until 6 otherwise ordered by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mrs. France is 72 years of age. She owns a home in which she lives alone, but has no source of regular income, and her health will permit her to earn only a very small amount. She has two married daughters, by a former marriage, who are not in a position to give her any material aid.

She is the widow of Wesley L. France, who served in Co. H, 177th Pennsylvania Infantry, during the Civil war, to whom she was married February 7, 1907, and who died on June 7, 1921.
