STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to the Detention of Operators of Motor
Vehicles while under the Influence of Intoxicating Liquor.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Whoever owns, operates or in any way con-
2 trols, whether as clerk, agent or servant, any garage, gaso-
3 line filling station, parking place, or other place where
4 automobilists are accomodated with supplies, shall retain
5 in his custody the operator of a motor vehicle who is at all
6 under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs, and
7 who stops or calls at such place of business, and shall also
8 forthwith notify the most available officer to come to such
9 place of business for the purpose of arresting such person,

10 and shall deliver such operator to the custody of such offi-
11 cer upon his arrival thereat.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates the provisions of this section
2 shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten nor more
3 than fifty dollars.
