STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Compensation of Selectmen and Assessors.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section ninety of chapter ten of the revised statutes is 2 hereby amended by striking out the whole of said section

3 and inserting in place thereof the following:

'Sect. 90. If any town does not choose assessors, the

 ${f 2}$ selectmen shall be the assessors, and each of them shall be

3 sworn as an assessor; and each selectman and assessor shall

4 be paid for his services, two dollars and fifty cents for

5 every day necessarily and actually employed in the service

6 of the town. Towns having fifteen hundred or more in-

7 habitants shall pay their selectmen and assessors a compen-

8 sation of not less than four dollars a day for services actu9 ally performed for the town, and a town having less than
10 fifteen hundred inhabitants may, by major vote at its annual
11 town meeting fix the compensation of its selectmen and
12 assessors at any sum commensurate with their services rend13 ered the town, but not exceeding five dollars a day for their
14 services actually performed.'
