STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Regulate the Sale of Oleomargarine or Any Other Substitute for Butter.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
To amend section seven of chapter one hundred and thirty
2 of the revised statutes of nineteen hundred and sixteen by
3 striking out all of section seven and by inserting in place
4 thereof the following:

'Sect. 2. No person shall by himself, his clerk, servant 2 or agent, furnish oleomargarine or any other substitute in-3 stead of butter in any hotel, restaurant, boarding house, 4 lunch room or lunch cart to a guest or patron thereof with-5 out notifying said guest or patron that the substance so

6 furnished is not butter by placing on the walls of said hotel, 7 restaurant, boarding house, lunch room or lunch cart where 8 oleomargarine or other substitutes is served, a white placard 9 on which is printed in black ink, in plain Roman letters of 10 not less than three inches in length and not less than two 11 inch in width the words "Oleomargarine sold or used here," 12 or the name of substitute displayed on the placard instead 13 of the word oleomargarine, such placard to be displayed 14 at all times exposed in such conspicuous place as to be read-15 ily seen by any and all persons entering such hotel dining 16 room, restaurant, boarding house, lunch room or lunch cart, 17 where oleomargarine or other substitutes is served.'
