STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, in Favor of Arthur H. King of Turner, for State
Pension.

Resolved: That there be paid to Arthur H. King of Turner, the sum of twelve dollars per month, payable quarterly from the fund appropriated for soldiers' pensions, beginning January one, nineteen hundred and twenty-five, and continuing during the pleasure of the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mr. King served in Battery A, Maine Heavy Artillery, in the Spanish war; he contracted malarial poisoning and resulting disease; his feet also were injured. He is hardly able to do any work towards his support; he is largely dependent on a son, who is not financially able to support him.
