STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, in Favor of Bessie E. King of Belfast, for State
Pension.

Resolved: That there be paid to Bessie E. King of Belfast,
2 the sum of twelve dollars per month, payable quarterly from
3 the fund appropriated for soldiers' pensions, beginning Jan-
4 uary one, nineteen hundred and twenty-five and continuing
5 during the pleasure of the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mrs. King is thirty-two years of age, the daughter of Andrew Johnson who served in the navy in the late Civil War, and is now deceased. Her husband, who was the supporter of the family, died a few years ago of influenza during the prevalence of this epidemic.
