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RESOLVE, in Favor of the Penobscot Tribe of Indians for  
the General Care, Maintenance, and Education Thereof.

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Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from  
2 the state treasury to be expended under the direction of the  
3 governor and council by the agent of the Penobscot tribe  
4 of Indians, for the benefit of said tribe for the year from  
5 July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-five to June thir-  
6 tieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-six, and for the year  
7 from July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-six to June  
8 thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven, as follows:

Amounting to twenty-five thousand, three hundred and  
 2 thirty-five dollars and fifty-five cents, for the year from  
 3 July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-five to June thir-  
 4 tieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-six; and twenty-five  
 5 thousand, three hundred and thirty-five dollars and fifty-five  
 6 cents, for the year from July first, nineteen hundred and

7 twenty-six to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-  
8 seven.

And be it further resolved, that any balance of any of the  
2 sub-divisions above named and not required for the pur-  
3 pose may, upon recommendation of the state auditor, be  
4 transferred by the governor and council to pay bills against  
5 any of the above sub-divisions where bills may have been  
6 contracted in excess of the amount above set forth.

## STATEMENT OF FACTS

This resolve provides funds for the support and maintenance of the Penobscot Tribe of Indians for the fiscal years nineteen hundred and twenty-six and nineteen hundred and twenty-seven and is similar in character to one presented at previous sessions of the legislature.
