STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Taking of Clams in Machiasport.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Chapter sixty-three, section one, of the private and special
2 laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-three is hereby amend-
3 ed by adding at the end of said section the following: 'EX-
4 cepting, however, all that part of the clam flats in the town
5 of Machiasport that lies northerly of a line that starts at
6 the sea wall point at the entrance to Little Kennebec river
7 in the town of Roque Bluffs and extends east to the shore
8 of said Machiasport'; so that said section as amended shall
9 read as follows:

'Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person not a resi-

2 dent of the town of Machiasport, in the county of Wash-
3 ington, to dig clams for commercial purposes within the
4 limits of said town. Excepting, however, all that part of
5 the clam flats in the town of Machiasport that lies northerly
6 of a line that starts at the sea wall point at the entrance to
7 Little Kennebec river in the town of Roque Bluffs and ex-
8 tends east to the shore of said Machiasport.'
