STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, in Favor of an Amendment to the Constitution of the United States to Prohibit the Employment of Women and Children in Workshops, Factories, Manufacturing or Mechanical Establishments for More than Forty-eight Hours in a Week.

Whereas, uniformity of hours of labor of women and children in industry is necessary for the economic welfare of the United States, and is desirable for humanitarian reasons;

Resolved: 1. That the people of the state of Maine request of the congress of the United States that the congress submit to the several states of the union an amendment to the constitution of the United States prohibiting the em-

5 ployment of children under the age of sixteen years and
6 of women of any age in workshops, factories, manufactur-
7 ing or mechanical establishments for more than forty-eight
8 hours in a week.

2. That certified copies of this resolve under the seal of
2 the state be sent by the secretary of state to the president
3 of the senate of the United States and the speaker of the
4 house of representatives of the United States.
