STATE OF MAINE

**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE**

AN ACT Relating to the Enforcement of Liens on Watches,
Clocks and Jewelry for Labor and Materials Furnished in
Making and Repairing Same.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section two of chapter two hundred and ninety-five of
2 the public laws of nineteen hundred and seventeen is hereby
3 amended so that said section as amended shall read as
4 follows:

'Sect. 2. The lien holder shall retain such watch, clock
2 or jewelry for a period of one year, at the expiration of
3 which time, if such lien is not satisfied, he may sell such
4 watch, clock or jewelry at public or private sale, after giving
5 thirty days' notice in writing to the owner, specifying the
6 amount due, describing the property to be sold and inform-

7 ing him that the payment of such amount within thirty
8 days will entitle him to redeem such property. Such notice
9 may be given by mailing the same addressed to the owner's
10 place of residence if known, or if the owner's place of
11 residence is unknown, a copy of such notice may be posted
12 in two public places in the town, village or city where the
13 property is held.'
