STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to the Digging of Clams in Biddeford, in
the County of York.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person not an
2 inhabitant of the state of Maine or not a temporary resi-
3 dent of the city of Biddeford, in the county of York, to dig
4 clams within said city of Biddeford; such inhabitants of
5 the state of Maine and temporary residents of the city of
6 Biddeford shall dig not more than one bushel of clams in
7 any one day for home consumption, until they shall receive
8 a written permit therefor from the municipal officers of

9 said city and upon payment to said city of such license fee
10 as may be ordained.

Sect. 2. No person, not an inhabitant of said city of Bid-
2 deford shall dig clams for commercial purposes within said
3 city.

Sect. 3. Whoever violates the provisions of this act, for
2 each offense, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding
3 twenty-five dollars, or by imprisonment not exceeding thirtv
4 days.
