STATE OF MAINE

THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Provide for the Use of Surplus Power.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Corporations for the purpose of purchasing,
2 generating, transporting, transmitting and selling electric
3 current or energy, however generated, may be organized,
4 under the general law, in the manner prescribed in chapter
5 fifty-one of the revised statutes and acts amendatory there-
6 of or additional thereto.

Sect. 2. Any corporation organized under this act, shall
2 have authority to purchase surplus power, at a price, not
3 to exceed five mills per k. w. hour and to transmit, deliver

4 and sell the same, at a price not to exceed two cents per
5 k. w. hour.

Sect. 3. Corporations organized under this act may build
2 and operate power stations; may build transmission lines,
3 furnish, deliver and sell electric energy, to any person, firm
4 or corporation, wherever located, if, within the borders of
5 the state of Maine.

Sect. 4. All acts, or, parts of acts, conflicting, in any way,
2 with the rights and privileges conferred by this act, are,
3 hereby amended and modified in such a way as to permit
4 and insure all the rights and privileges conferred by this act.
