STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Fishing for Smelts in Winnegance Creek.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. *Taking of smelts in tidal waters of Winnegance creek, regulated.* No smelts shall be caught, taken or fished for in any way other than by hook and line in the tidal waters of Winnegance creek, a creek lying in the city of Bath and towns of Phippsburg and West Bath, in the county of Sagadahoc.

Sect. 2. *Penalty.* Whoever violates the provisions of section one of this act shall pay a fine not less than fifty or more than one hundred dollars and costs for each offense.

Sect. 3. *Inconsistent acts repealed.* All acts or parts of
2 acts inconsistent herewith, so far as the same relates to this
3 act, are repealed.
