STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Electus Oakes
of Thorndike.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Resolved: That a pension of twelve dollars per month
2 be and hereby is granted to Electus Oakes of Thorndike, to
3 be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers
4 and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July first,
5 nineteen hundred and twenty-nine, and continue until other-
6 wise provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Electus Oakes is the son of Electus Oakes who served in Company E, 12th Maine Infantry, during the Civil war. Mr. Oakes has had portions of his leg amputated at four different times and is thoroughly disabled. He asks for this relief from the state on the ground that he is the son of an honorably discharged veteran of the Civil war.
