## STATE OF MAINE

# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

An Act Relative to Jurisdiction of Applications for Naturalization.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section one hundred two of chapter eighty-two of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out the words
3 "and superior courts" and the word "respectively" in the
4 first line of said section, so that said section as amended
5 shall read as follows:

'Sect. 102. Jurisdiction of applications for naturalization. 2 The supreme judicial court shall have jurisdiction of ap-3 plications for naturalization. No other court established 4 by this state shall entertain any primary or final declara5 tion or application made by or in behalf of an alien to be-6 come a citizen of the United States, or entertain jurisdic-7 tion of the naturalization of aliens.'
