STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to the Taking of Smelts in the Tributaries
of Three Mile Pond.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section one of chapter three hundred and thirty-four of the public laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-nine is hereby amended by inserting after the word "fish" in the second and eighth lines thereof the words "except smelts" so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish except smelts in Barton brook in the town of Windsor; or in Sabin brook in the town of China; or in Webber brook in the town of China; or in Whitehouse brook in the town of Vassalboro, and all brooks flowing into Three Mile pond in the county of Kennebec, until April fifteenth, nineteen hundred and thirty-four.

It shall also be unlawful for any person to have in possession any kind of fish except smelts at any time taken in violation of any provision of this section.'
