IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT to Open Jacquith Pond and Peters Pond, in Piscata-
quis County, to Ice Fishing.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Jacquith Pond and Peters Pond, Piscataquis County, Opened to ice fishing. It shall be lawful to fish for, take, catch or kill salmon, trout, togue, and white perch through the ice in Jacquith Pond, in the town of Brownville, and in Peters Pond, in T. 4, R. 8, in the county of Piscataquis, under the provisions of the general law relating to ice fishing.
