STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Length and Daily Limit of Fish in Stanley Ponds, so-called, in Hiram and Porter, County of Oxford.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, catch or kill at any time any salmon less than sixteen inches in length, in the waters of Stanley Ponds, so-called, in Hiram and Porter, county of Oxford.

It shall also be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, catch or kill more than two fish in all in any one day in said Stanley Ponds, so-called, in Hiram and Porter, county of Oxford.
