STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Closing Moosehorn Stream, and All Its Tributaries,
to Fishing.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Close time on fishing in Moosehorn Stream, and all its tributaries; possession unlawful. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish in Moosehorn Stream, or in any of the tributaries to said stream, in the county of Washington, until July fifteenth, nineteen hundred and thirty-three.

It shall also be unlawful for any person to have in possession any kind of fish at any time taken in violation of any provision of this section.

Sect. 2. Penalty for violation. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall be subject to the general penalty provided in section one hundred seven of chapter thirty-eight of the revised statutes for violation of the fish and game laws.
