STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to the Use of Beam Trawlers, within
Certain Areas.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

The use of beam trawlers or flounder drags and gill nets for ground fish shall be prohibited in the area within the following lines: beginning at Indian Point on Georgetown Island, thence easterly to the northern end of Damiscove Island, thence in a straight line to the most southern point on Linkin's Neck.
