IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Regulating Fishing in Kennebago Stream.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, sec. 21, regulating fishing in Kennebago Stream. Section twenty-one of chapter thirty-eight of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out, in the fortieth and forty-first lines of the thirty-fourth paragraph thereof the words "to the outlet of said stream at Indian Rock" and by inserting in lieu thereof the following: 'down to the old piers, so-called, at the mouth of said Kennebago stream at the point where the said stream enters Cupsuptic lake;' so that the reference to Kennebago stream, in lines thirty-four to forty-one inclusive of the thirty-fourth paragraph of section thirty-one shall read as follows: 'Kennebago stream (1919, c. 134; 1921, c. 19; 1923, c. 196, sec. 3), the outlet of Kennebago lake in Franklin county and Oxford county, except it shall be lawful for a person fishing in the ordinary way of angling with artificial flies or fly-fishing to take one fish in any one day from the time the ice is out of said waters in the spring until the thirtieth day of September following of each year, both days inclusive, from dawn until darkness sets in each day from the Big Falls on Kennebago stream down to the old piers, socalled, at the mouth of said Kennebago stream at the point where the said stream enters Cupsuptic lake;'
