STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Regulating Fishing in Cupsuptic Lake Tributaries.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Tributaries to Cupsuptic Lake closed to fishing. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, catch, or kill any kind of fish in any of the tributaries to Cupsuptic Lake, situated in Franklin and Oxford Counties, with the exception of Cupsuptic River and Kennebago Stream.

Sect. 2. Penalty for violation. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall be subject to the general penalty provided in section one hundred seven of chapter thirty-eight of the revised statutes for violation of the fish and game laws.
