AN ACT Closing the Tributaries of Thomas Pond to all
Fishing.

To the Honorable Members of the Senate and House of
Representatives of the State of Maine:

We the undersigned residents of South Casco in the County
of Cumberland, wishing to assist as much as possible the
Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game, do respectfully
ask that all tributaries to Thomas Pond, so-called, in the
towns of Casco and Raymond in said County of Cumberland
be closed indefinitely to all fishing.

These tributaries were closed in 1930 until July 1931 by
Commissioner Stobie at a special hearing in Casco and at his
earnest recommendation we are seeking this legislation:

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Tributaries to Thomas Pond closed. All tributaries to
Thomas Pond, so-called, in the towns of Casco and Raymond,
in the county of Cumberland, are closed to all fishing.
