AN ACT Relating to the Board of Harbor Commissioners  
For the Harbor of Portland.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

That chapter one hundred and ninety-two of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and seventeen be amended by striking out the whole of section one of said chapter and substituting for said section one the following:

'Section 1. Four persons, two of whom shall always be residents of the city of Portland and two of whom shall always be residents of the city of South Portland, shall constitute the board of harbor commissioners for the harbor of Portland, hereinafter referred to as the board. The members of the board shall be appointed by the governor, with the advice and consent of the council, to serve for a term of four years. The governor, with the advice and consent of the council, shall fill all vacancies occurring by the expiration of the term of office of a member of the board, or by the death or resignation of a member, or by the change of residence of a member from the city in which his residence shall be necessary to render him eligible for membership upon the board, as herein provided; and the person appointed to fill such vacancy shall hold said office until the end of the term for which the member whom he succeeds was appointed.'
