STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT to Prohibit the Use of Automobiles or Motor
Vehicles on Bowery Beach or Crescent Beach in the Town of
Cape Elizabeth, County of Cumberland and State of Maine.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

Section 1. No automobile or motor vehicle shall be set up, used, driven, or operated in or upon Bowery Beach, so called, or Crescent Beach, within the Town of Cape Elizabeth, in the County of Cumberland and State of Maine.

Sect. 2. Whoever sets up, uses, drives or operates any automobile or motor vehicle contrary to the provisions of section one hereof, shall on first conviction be punished by a fine of twenty dollars and costs on prosecution, and on second and every subsequent conviction shall be punished by a fine of fifty dollars and costs on prosecution or by imprisonment for not exceeding sixty days or by both fine and imprisonment.

Whereas Bowery Beach, also known as Crescent Beach, in the Town of Cape Elizabeth in the County of Cumberland and State of Maine, is used as a bathing beach by many people and by small children, and

Whereas many small children are continuously upon this beach a great hazard exists from the use of motor vehicles on this beach.
