STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT regulating fishing in Cambolasse Pond and Cambolasse Stream, in Lincoln.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. Cambolasse Pond, in the town of Lincoln, closed to ice fishing. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, catch, kill, or have in possession any kind of fish at any time, on or through the ice in Cambolasse Pond, which pond is situated in the town of Lincoln, in the county of Penobscot.

Sect. 2. Cambolasse Stream closed to all fishing. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, catch, kill, or have in possession any kind of fish at any time in Cambolasse Stream, so-called, lying between the head of Cambolasse Pond and the foot of Long Pond, in the town of Lincoln, in the county of Penobscot.

Sect. 3. Penalty for violation. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall be subject to the general penalty provided in section one hundred seven of chapter thirty-eight of the revised statutes for violation of the fish and game laws.
