STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT to Protect Cod in Waters off the Coast of Lincoln and Sagadahoc Counties.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Cod protected off coasts of Lincoln and Sagadahoc counties. Chapter sixty-two of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred five as amended by chapter one hundred forty-two of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred fifteen is hereby amended by striking out section one of chapter one hundred forty-two of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred fifteen, and inserting in place thereof the following:

'Section I. Cod and other ground fish protected in certain waters. It shall be unlawful to fish for or to take with beam trawls or gill nets any cod or other ground fish from the waters of Sheepscot Bay that border on the town of Georgetown, in the county of Sagadahoc, and the town of Southport, in the county of Lincoln, State of Maine, northerly of a line projecting from the north end of Damariscove Island to the north end of Seguin Island.'
